WICET and the Environment

Covered conveyors to reduce noise and dust

Automated placement of coal on stockpiles to reduce dust

Vegetation offsets established to maintain natural flora and fauna systems

Water management system for stormwater harvesting and water recycling

Rail receival located north-west of Gladstone to reduce impact on the community

Protected flora species relocated to alternative local sites for preservation

Terminal Performance

Each stockpile can be up to 18m high with total stockyard capacity of 1.85Mt

Overland conveyor – 5.6km, belt width 1,800mm, belt speed 6.9m/s

Gantry system spans two stockyard rows with two 125m wide travelling bridge sections

Loading rate – 8,250tph

Unloading Rate 8,250tph
